Narrative / Comments		
At approximately 3:35 A.M., while patrolling the gated community, a Bal Harbour police officer observed that a power outage had just occurred along Bal Bay Drive and north of Park Drive. Florida Power and Light was immediately notified and responded within a few minutes. Power was restored to the area by 4:45 AM.

While conducting an area check of Collins Avenue a Bal Harbour police officer discovered a total of 20 landscaping lights damaged by what appeared to be an act of criminal mischief.
